Mary-Kim Arnold has joined the Artist Communities Alliance (ACA) leadership team as Chief of Staff. A resident of Pawtucket, Rhode Island, Mary-Kim is a writer and artist with an active practice and more than two decades of administrative leadership experience in the arts, humanities, and education.

Most recently, Mary-Kim served as Dean of the Faculty & Academic Affairs at Vermont College of Fine Arts (VCFA), overseeing the college's six graduate programs. For six years prior, she taught creative and critical writing in the Nonfiction Writing Program at Brown University. With experience in creative nonfiction, poetry, and cultural criticism, Mary-Kim has also taught at Wheaton College, Temple University, Rhode Island School of Design, and in the Newport MFA at Salve Regina University.

Mary-Kim began her career in administration in Brown University's Office of Alumni Relations, where she worked with the newly-formed affinity groups for alumni of color. She has served as Executive Director for the Rhode Island Council for the Humanities, an independent nonprofit affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities, and as Program Officer for arts and culture at the Rhode Island Foundation, where she also was appointed to be the inaugural Director of Evaluation and Learning.

A brilliant and seasoned advocate for artist communities and creators, she excels at transforming ideas into impactful actions.
